properties in Virginia for \$200 million in cash.

The company reported a net income of \$103.3 million for the first nine months of the year, compared to \$88.8 million for the same period in 2012, according to its quarterly financial report.

In DeBary, Maryland-based Dinwiddie Enterprises spent \$2.1 million buying the self-storage center at 51 Spring Vista Drive, according to Volusia County property records.

The private company has renamed the 435-unit facility South DeBary Self Storage. Dinwiddie owns 22 self-storage businesses in Florida, Maryland, New Jersey, North Carolina and Virginia.

Clark has even gotten into the buying mode. In September, the company bought the self-storage facility on Jackson Street in Port Orange. The land and buildings were bought for \$800,000. The price for the business was not disclosed.

"It's a nice property and well-maintained,' Clark said. "It's also a strategic move. It's the only (self-storage) facility in Port Orange we didn't own." It's the first self-storage facility Clark has bought since 2007.

"Our occupancy rates are up 6 percent from a year ago when they were in the upper 70s," Clark said. "Now they are in the mid-80s. That's strong.'

Higher occupancy rates also allow owners to make property improvements that were put off during the economic downturn, said Clark. He plans to expand the self-storage facility at the Masanova Shopping Center in Daytona Beach. No timetable has been set.

Ave. in Edgewater is also expanding. It recently received a \$100,000 building permit for a new 6,000-square-foot building and plans two other new buildings.

However, those plans are on hold while a couple of acres are cleared to provide more outdoor parking storage for boats, RVs and trucks, said Lillian Girone, resident manager.

'We're busy. It's the economy. People are buying more homes and moving about and need storage," Girone said. "We are 87 percent rented. That's good. We were down in the 70s last year and struggling.'

There are 48,500 self-storage facilities in the U.S., which generated more than \$22 billion in revenue in 2012, according the Alexandria, Va.-based Self Storage Association. More than half the self-storage centers are owned by one-facility landlords.
